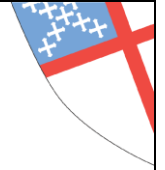

Dear People of God,

Two weeks ago, the Rectors of St. David's by the Sea in Cocoa Beach, St. John's in Melbourne, and Holy Apostles in Satellite Beach entered into a covenant to launch a combined Youth Ministry that will begin in the fall of 2015, gathering on Sunday evenings from 6-8pm. The initial plan is to launch both a middle school and a Senior High School ministry. The weekly meetings will take place at Holy Trinity Upper School on the Pineda Causeway between US1 and Wickham Road. The initial funding for this combined ministry will come from the churches, although we have applied for a 2015 Congregational Development Grant that would fully fund this venture for the coming year.

I am excited about this new ministry for several reasons:

- a) This will provide an opportunity for our youth to gather together with other Episcopal Youth (and friends) for fellowship, fun and experiential learning.
- b) This will be an opportunity for the three member churches (and hopefully others in the area!) to work together in a joint venture
- c) This is a great opportunity to create an intentional ministry to and for young people with greater resources than any of the individual churches could afford.
- d) We hope and pray that this form of youth ministry could be duplicated around the Diocese among churches with a handful of youth and limited resources.

Please pray for this new work that the seeds planted for the Lord and the Gospel will bear much fruit in the lives of our youth and in our communities!

### About our woodworker...

#### Eric Johnson of Treehouse Woodworks-

Eric is well known as a "woodie" enthusiast and restorer of wooden body and wood panel cars and trucks. He is well known as a person who can create, fix or restore anything made out of real wood. Eric first visited Cocoa Beach in 1969 on a trip from Massachusetts. He served in the military in Vietnam and returned to settle here in 1974. Originally he made custom wood furniture from driftwood on his front porch shop, but has since moved on to his custom woodworking shop on Brevard Avenue where he has honed his craft for over 30 years. His greatest passion is building and restoring 1935-1951 Ford wagons, often having to fashion body parts and even hinges to complete his projects. Eric proudly made the altar rail that now graces St. David's by the Sea Episcopal Church and is completing the rest of the moldings and altar furnishings for the altar area.

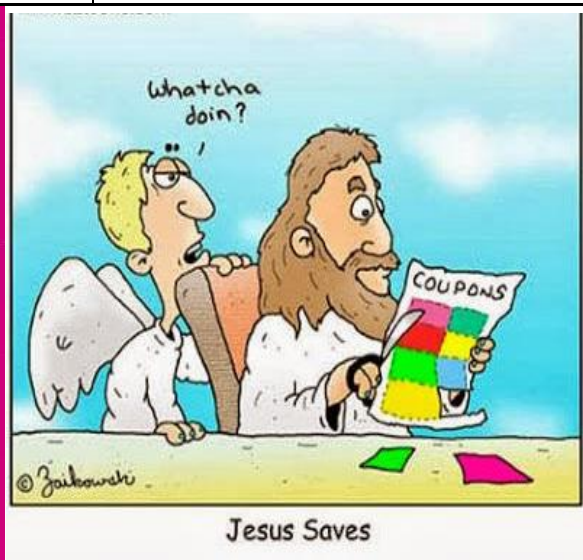
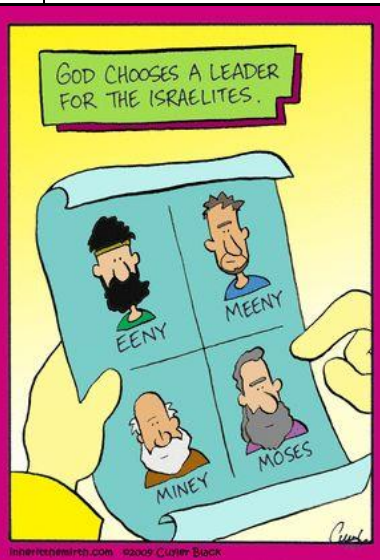

**About the new window glass installed in the north wall of the church:**

This week as the hurricane glass was being installed I spoke with the installer who said that the "blank" from which this was fabricated was the largest size piece of glass available (9'x5') that would meet the current wind load this close to the ocean (160mph). The center piece of glass weighs over 300 pounds. The aluminum frame was installed with 8' metal studs reinforced by 2x8 pressure treated wood to insure a solid installation. 5/8 inch rubber trim keeps the window firmly in the frame. After installation it was also wet glazed to insure that it is water tight and can withstand extreme pressure changes.

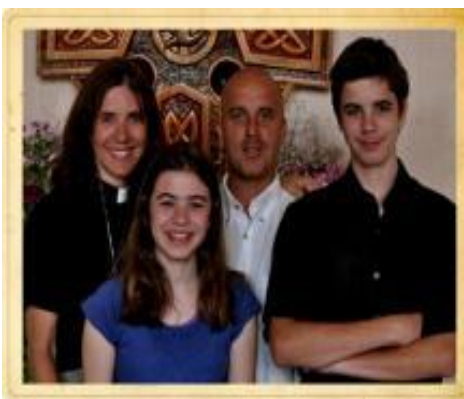

**Fr. Scott's Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cookie recipe:**

1 c vegetable shortening Crisco  
¾ c white sugar  
¾ c light brown sugar  
1 t salt  
1 t baking soda  
2 eggs  
1 and ½ c all purpose flour  
2 c quick oats  
1 and ½ c chocolate chips  
(mix in order given, drop by rounded teaspoonful onto lightly greased cookie sheet- bake 350 degrees
